We have tentatively booked swimming lessons on October 5th - 8th from 1 - 2:30 p.m. However we are still trying to work out the details. If we are not able to finalize the plans in time, we may need to reschedule them for a later date. We had anticipated the Kindergarten students to attend the two extra days in order for them to be able to

participate in the lessons as well . Should we need to reschedule the lessons, then Kindergarten days will only be on October 6th and 8th. I will be asking for swimming levels if we are able go ahead with lessons.

Parents/Guardians Entering the School During the School Day:

- For early pick up of a child, please call the office and we will send your child to meet you outside the West (main) doors. Please wait for your child outside and do not enter the building. All exterior school doors will be locked during the school day.
- If you wish to arrange a meeting with your child's teacher or the principal, please call the school (306-778-9280) to arrange an appointment.
- To enter the building, parents/guardians must call the office from outside the building to be screened for entry. A staff member will ask them the COVID-19 screening questions, they will be required to wear a mask, use hand sanitizer upon entry, and must sign in at the office. These protocols are in place to limit the number of visitors in our school and to keep both staff and students safe.
- If items need to be dropped off for your child, please notify the office and place the item in the "drop-off" bin outside the main doors. We will deliver the item to your child.



Sick Children:

- There is a strict stay-at-home policy for any students or staff exhibiting symptoms of COVID-19 (even if symptoms resemble a mild cold). Visit the Saskatchewan Health Authority's website for a list of COVID-19 symptoms.
- If a child becomes ill while at school a parent or guardian will be contacted to pick up the child immediately and the following will take place:
 - The classroom teacher will notify the principal or designate, who will take the child to the isolation room.
 - The sick child will remain in this room until a parent/guardian/ emergency contact is able to pick them up.
 - Sick children will not be allowed to ride the bus at the end of the day.
 - The child's family will call Public Health (811) and receive further direction.
