November will be another busy and exciting month at Stewart Valley School with some major events planned for our students. We will focus on the theme of respect as our virtue of the month as we thought this tied in well with discussions and activities related to Remembrance Day. Remembrance Day Service and Holliday

•We will be holding our Remembrance Day Service on Friday, November 8th at 2 pm. Families and the community are welcome to join us. Students are encouraged to dress in a formal manner on the 8th. There is no school on Monday, November 11th in observance of Remembrance Day.

Duck, Cover, and Hold Drill

•The school will be conducting a Duck, Cover, and Hold drill on November 13th. This process is practiced as part of the school safety plan and is the procedure used in case of structural damage where objects or debris may be falling from above. The purpose of the plan is to make sure that in the event of an emergency, students and staff have been trained in order to be prepared if such a situation took place. Please take some time to speak with your child about the need for having a plan and being prepared if an emergency ever took place at school.

Reunification Plan

•In the event of a situation where students need to be evacuated from the school, our evacuation site is the Happy Valley Senior Centre. If an evacuation is necessary, parents will be contacted and reunification will take place at the Senior Centre.

Swimming Lessons

•Students in Kindergarten through Grade 5 will take swimming lessons from November 18th to 21st. Students will be bussed to the Swift Current Aquatic Centre at noon and will return to school for dismissal at 3:05.

Farm Safety Presentation

•Grades 3 to 6 students will have the opportunity to participate in a Farm Safety Day hosted at Stewart Valley School on November 26th. Students from Waldeck and Success will join us on this day for this fun and interactive event.

Parent-Teacher Conferences


•Parent-Teacher Conferences are scheduled for November 27th and 28th. We look forward to meeting with students and families to discuss the learning that has gone on so far this year.
