Students in Room 3 worked on their Science Fair Projects and submitted their hard work. Browse through the rest of the newsletter to find the results.

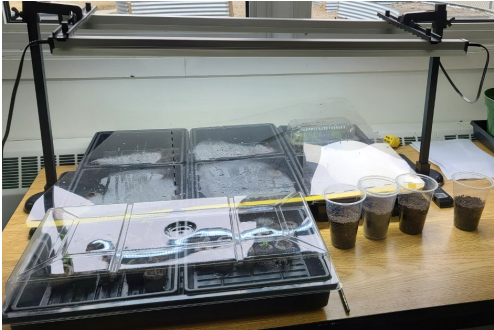
